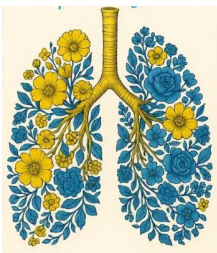


UMANA Illinois Branch Doesn't Just Dance! Debutantes Raise \$32,000 for Baby Bronchoscopes at Annual Ball

OHIO BRANCH members **Laura Bukavina, MD**, **Andrew Drozd, MD**, and **Tatyana Gabyak, PA**, were part of an eight-member urologic surgical team that traveled to Danylo Halytsky University Hospital in Lviv, Ukraine, for a week-long reconstructive urologic mission in October 2025. This was their third coordinated effort in Ukraine. The team also included: Drs. Shubham Gupta, Adam Calaway, George Koch, and Patrick Mershon. Over the course of the mission, the team operated on 24 patients, including 6 wounded military personnel, addressing a wide range of complex reconstructive needs. This mission reflects UMANA members' ongoing commitment to supporting Ukraine high-impact medical service and surgical education.

Chapter member **Mykhailo Samotowka, MD**, has taken an active role in surgical education regarding trauma surgery and critical care. He has participated in multiple conferences across Ukraine. **George Jaskiw, MD**, also participated in medical conferences in Kyiv and Lviv.

Ohio Branch has continued with their humanitarian medical efforts with donations of surgical and medical supplies, and in conjunction with UMANA Foundation, a high-speed Lenovo computer for 3D printing capabilities for reconstructive surgeries.



UMANA MEMBER NEWS

Orest BALYTSKY, DMD (Northern California Branch) made his second dental mission trip to Ukraine in November 2025. His older daughter, Iryna, accompanied him, working as a makeshift dental assistant. For three weeks they worked at a dental clinic run by Dental Front, a volunteer organization focused on providing dental services for the Ukrainian military, located in a small town near Lviv, close to a military base. His focus was to provide endodontic treatment, but out of necessity, Dr. Balytsky also performed restorative dental procedures. He was very impressed to see soldiers from foreign countries such as Brazil and Colombia serving in the Ukrainian Armed Forces. Dr. Balytsky and Iryna also spent a few days in Kyiv, where they participated in a conference for military dentists.

He also states that there is a great need for dental supplies for military dental clinics. If you have any equipment or materials that you could donate, you can contact Dr. Balytsky.



Oksana JACKSON, MD (Pennsylvania Branch) is a pediatric plastic surgeon at the Children's Hospital Philadelphia. She has been traveling to Ukraine one to two

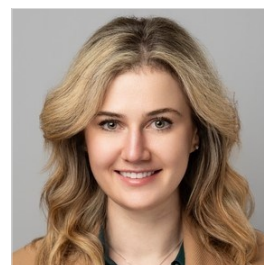
